

This is a hands-on session for primary teachers, designed to support different aspects of the Literacy curriculum, with a particular emphasis on poetry making. Original artworks from the Artemis collection are used as a stimulus for the creation of narrative, characters, dialogue in poetry and story making, encouraging children to explore ideas and develop the content of their writing and descriptive vocabulary.

The session will include:

- An introduction to a range of techniques and resources designed to support primary children to write amazing poetry!
- Practical activities to allow delegates to have a go at some of the approaches
- Review of how this technique links to national curriculum requirements
- Time to consider and plan next steps and organise an art loan from Artemis
- Resources to support the children in their written work
