

Copyright for printed music

Maintained schools in Leeds are covered by a collective Schools Printed Music Licence. Academies and Free Schools are responsible for making their own arrangements – please check before making any copies. This licence permits a school to copy works from UK printed music publications it already owns. However, there are exceptions, and this does not cover:

- Copying music owned by one school for use in another
- Copyright music which is owned by you personally, or is owned by an organisation other than the school
- Copying music for lessons in which pupils are primarily taught instrumental or vocal technique (*in our terms, small group lessons*)
- Copying more than 10% of the items in an anthology of songs or pieces
- Any works explicitly excluded by the publisher
- Any music intended for collective worship
- Any choral leaflets

As copyright also applies to lyrics, it is not permitted to change the words to songs.

Any copies made must be marked with the date of copying, and must be destroyed at the end of each academic year.

ArtForms and the Leeds Music Education Partnership is not covered by this licence. Music owned by CLYM groups, music centres and cluster groups are therefore excluded.

It is not acceptable to use illegal photocopies, and puts you, the school where you work and ArtForms as a whole at risk of prosecution.
