The Cultural Learning Alliance

The [Cultural Learning Alliance](#) (CLA) is a national organisation who advocate for the right of children and young people to access arts and cultural education.

They do this through:

- Policy analysis and evidence gathering
- Dissemination of advocacy materials, including briefing papers, evidence and statistics
- Lobbying and advocacy
- Building strategic relationships across arts, culture, education and policy

There are two reports which they have written which provide evidence of the benefits of cultural learning. These are: [ImagineNation: the value of Cultural Learning](#) and [Key Research Findings: the case for Cultural Learning](#). Both documents are written in a concise and accessible form and are well worth a read.

Partnership working

Working in partnership with arts professionals can be an effective way of developing your school's arts and cultural curriculum, providing pupils with an engaging and stimulating experience and developing teachers' knowledge, skills and confidence.

On the 14th June, the Leeds Cultural Education Partnership, in partnership with Noctua and the Yorkshire Inclusive Schools Teaching Alliance, will host a full day conference for primary teachers and classroom practitioners. The day will include practical workshops delivered by a number of experienced arts and heritage providers. Covering different art forms, this will be a great opportunity to explore creative ideas and approaches and learn new skills which can be applied in the classroom.

In February, Education Secretary, Damian Hinds set out a vision for character and resilience education in schools.

He laid out 5 foundations for Building Character and pledged to work with schools and external organisations, including membership bodies and charities, to help every child access a range of activities. Creativity is one of the 5 foundations and "involves all creative activities from coding, arts and crafts, writing, graphic design, film making and music composition".
