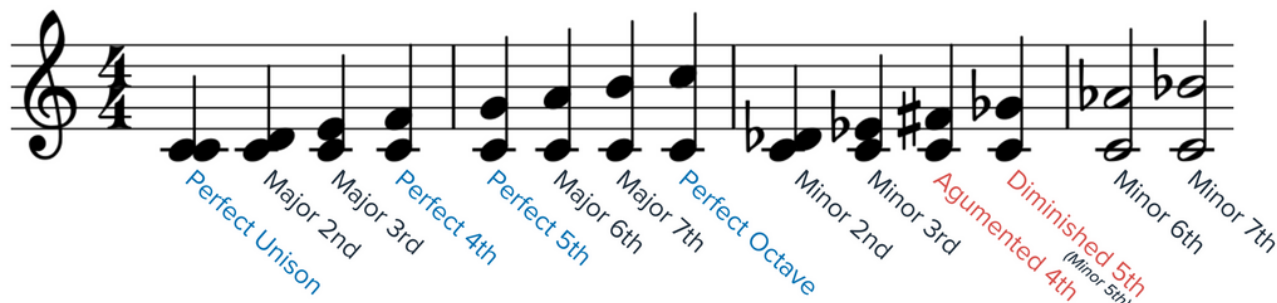


Identifying Major and Minor Intervals

An interval is the distance between one note to another.

Below are song suggestions that will help you to identify the different intervals.



These songs will help you to identify the intervals and hopefully make it a little easier for you!

Interval	Ascending	Descending	
Minor 2nd	The Jaws Theme		The introductory notes go up and down a minor second
Major 2nd	Happy Birthday		Up a major second and back down again: "Happy Birth-day"
Minor 3rd	Greensleeves	Hey Jude	The first two notes
Major 3rd	When the Saints Go Marching In	Swing Low, Sweet Chariot	"Oh when the saints" "Swing low, sweet chariot"
Perfect 4th	Amazing Grace	O Come All Ye Faithful	"A-maz-ing grace, how sweet the sound" "O come, all Ye faithful, joyful"
Perfect 5th	Twinkle Twinkle Little Star	The Flintstones Theme	"Twinkle, Twinkle, little star" "Flint-stones, meet the Flintstones"
Minor 6th	We Are Young	The Entertainer	"Set the world on fi-re" The Entertainer - the beginning of the main theme goes up and down a minor sixth (after the pick-up notes)

Interval	Ascending	Descending	
Major 6th	My Bonnie Lies Over the Ocean	Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen	"My bon -nie lies over the ocean" "No- bod -y knows the trouble"
Minor 7th	Somewhere (from West Side Story)		"There's a place for us"
Major 7th	Take on Me		"Take on me" (the first time)
