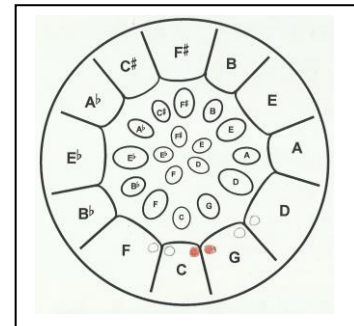
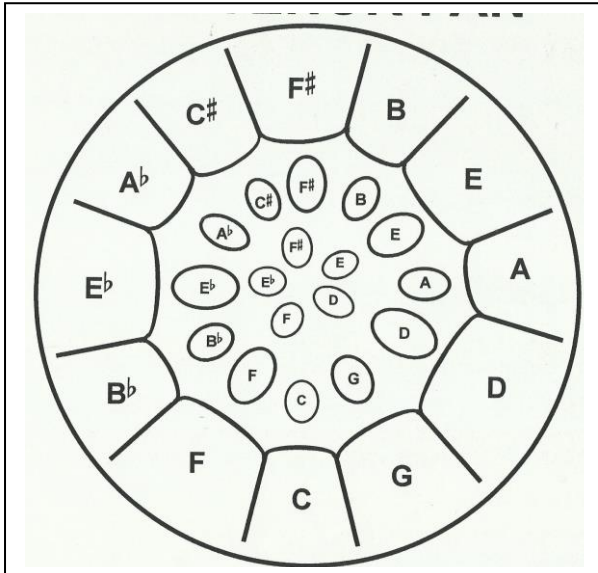


Steel Pans At Home [at Leeds ArtForms]

1. Copy and label or print off the diagram of the soprano pan as big as you can [up to about 60cm, or even 90cm diameter].

2. Stick the diagram onto card if possible. If you can't, put the diagram onto a table or similar hard surface.

3. Colour code the chords by putting the correct coloured dots on the notes. Here are the colours:

Chord of C [red] = C & G, Chord of G [green] = G & D, Chord of F [yellow] = F & C*

[See this smaller diagram on the right where the chord of C is done for you.]

4. Now find the notes [on the second and fourth lines of songsheet] from the song below and, with your fingers or wooden spoons, or anything tap where they are on your diagram.

5. Sing the note names as you "play" them [e.g. sing **EDCD** **EEE** etc]
