Ties

A curved line between two or more notes of the same pitch. The musician should play one long note to the duration of each individual notes.

Informs the musician to play a sequence of two or more notes without pausing between each note. Also known as legato.

A silent “tee” is made when the tongue strikes the roof of the mouth/the reed, briefly stopping the air flow through the instrument.

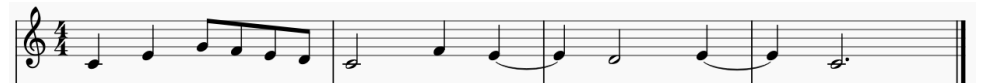
